Dominion under God

God Determines Our Options in History

"Woe to you, Chorazin! ... Bethsaida! For if the mighty works which were done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes ... it will be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon in the day of judgment than you." (Matt 11:21–22)

Dominion under God

God's Sovereignty Humbles Us

"Your dwelling shall be with the beasts of the field and they shall make you eat grass like an ox . . . till you know that the Most High rules in the kingdom of men, and gives it to whoever He chooses" (Dan 4:24–27)

God's Sovereignty Includes Personal Interaction

"Go, get down! For <u>your</u> people whom <u>you</u> brought out of the land of Egypt have corrupted themselves. ... I have seen this people, and indeed it is a stiff-necked people! Now, therefore, let Me alone, that My wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them. And I will make of you a great nation!" (Ex 32:7–10)

God's Sovereignty Includes Personal Interaction

"LORD, why does Your wrath burn hot against <u>Your</u> people whom <u>You</u> have brought them out of the land of Egypt with great power and a mighty hand? Why should the Egyptians speak, and say, 'He brought them out to harm them ... and to consume them from the face of the earth'? ... Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, Your servants, to whom You swore by Your own self, and said to them" (Ex 32:11–13)
